"There are trees that seem to die at the end of autumn. There are also the evergreens."-Gilbert Maxwell

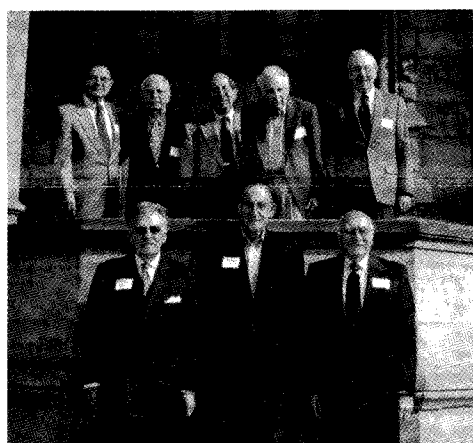

Brother Edwin Arsham is an executive in the insurance industry. Brother Rapport worked as an executive in an advertising agency. Brother Alvin Arsham became a real estate broker. Brother Friedman formed a manufacturing company. Brother Paull serves as senior vice president for First Union Securities. Brother Krashin is a chemical engineer. Brother Bialosky works as an attorney in general practice. While these men entered different fields of business and pursued a wide variety of endeavors, they never allowed their fraternal commitment to waiver.

From the President

In fact, we are already planning for the next school year with an even more increased presence on each campus with our professional staff. Financially, we remain strong and will end the year with enough of a surplus that we will be able to apply much of it to next year's budget and thereby avoid raising fees. Initiations have been steady and expansion has been good but slower than last year. Our staff continues to grow and the quantity and quality of services provided to our undergraduate Brothers increases by the month.

We have recently returned from our Spring Supreme Council meeting in Evanston, IL where we had very productive business sessions as well as a long range planning day so that we allocate our resources to their best advantage. Our alumni volunteers continue to be selfless in all of their work for ZBT.

As you may have noticed, we have been more regular in our publications to our alumni Brothers, and I intend to continue that trend. We have gotten very positive feedback from men who appreciate this effort. Our web site (www.zbt.org) has been greatly expanded as we add enhancements weekly. Be sure to check it out. If you have any suggestions, please let us know.

Another priority has been the rebuilding of the NPEF Corporation and we have been quite successful. A couple of years ago, it had deteriorated badly because of bad loans to Chapters. We now have a formalized set of consistent guidelines to which we adhere. Additionally, annual contributions from undergraduates have added to the NPEF assets.

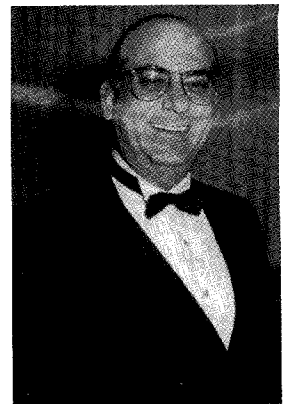

2001 Presidents Forum - Shaping ZBT's Undergraduate Leaders

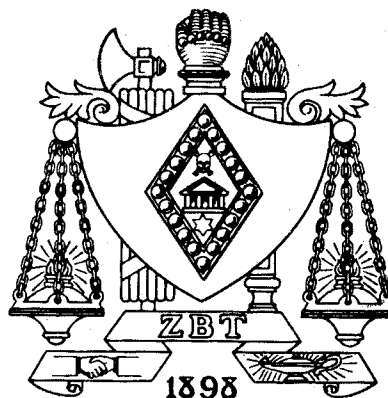

Remembering Roger Williams

On March 15, 2001, Zeta Beta Tau Fraternity continued its tradition of honoring Roger Williams. In a ceremony at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C., a wreath was placed before the statue of Williams by a delegation of Fraternity members and several Congressmen. Representative **Martin Frost** (Ω, Missouri, '64) of Texas, Representative Christopher Shays of Connecticut and Beta Zeta Epsilon Chapter President **David Nable** (BZE, Maryland-College Park, '02) offered remarks. Supreme Council Director **Bret W. Hrbek** (ΔΕ, Virginia Tech, '96) serves as the Chairman of the Roger Williams Day Celebration Committee and coordinated the event. ZBT National President **Rondald J. Taylor, M.D.** (IΦA, Washington & Jefferson, '63) also offered brief remarks to the assembled guests.

Roger Williams (1603 - 1683) is celebrated in American history as an early advocate of the freedom of religious worship and the separation of church and state. After being banished from the Massachusetts Bay Colony for his liberal teachings, Williams founded the Rhode Island colony and became its first governor. Williams' ideology had a great impact on the framers of the U.S. Constitution.

ZBT began to celebrate the works of this important historical figure in the 1920's as a symbol of the religious freedoms offered to citizens of the United States. In his remarks, David Nable iterated the relevance of Williams' teachings in our modern society.

"Hardly ever does one stop to think about how Williams' teachings were at one time considered revolutionary. There are countless religions represented at the University of Maryland, many of which have facilities for student use that are within walking distance to campus. If only Roger Williams could see us today.

"Religious freedom. Living without fear of persecution. The ability to publicly celebrate the holidays of your culture. These are things that to this day are denied to people all over the world. Yet, we as Americans enjoy these luxuries."

The High Order Featuring ZBT's Best and Brightest

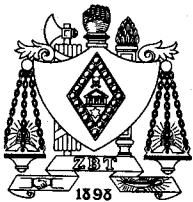
